Support Clubs

With increased and recurring fiscal support, Florida's Boys & Girls Clubs will serve more youth with high-quality afterschool programming that provides essential skills and knowledge necessary for young people to achieve great futures.



Every dollar invested in Boys & Girls Clubs returns \$9.60 in current and future earnings and cost-savings to their communities.

Clubs by the Numbers

243 sites served over **213,416 youth**.

Mentoring

- **4,161** monthly sessions
- **Over 6,300** grade 5–12 students participated in monthly group mentoring, one-on-one mentoring or peer mentoring

Academic Support Programs

- **Over 95,700** K–12 students participated in Academic Support Programs
- **Over 117,600** students served through Community Outreach

Prevention Programs

- Club teens are **less likely to receive school referrals** while a member of the program
- Club teens are **more likely to abstain from alcohol and drug use** than teens nationally
- **Over 5,000** Club teens participated in Opioid Awareness programs

Parental Support

- **83%** of parents agree that afterschool programs help working parents keep their jobs
- **82%** of parents agree that afterschool programs help give working parents peace of mind
- **81%** of students qualify for free or reduced-price school meals
